Editorial

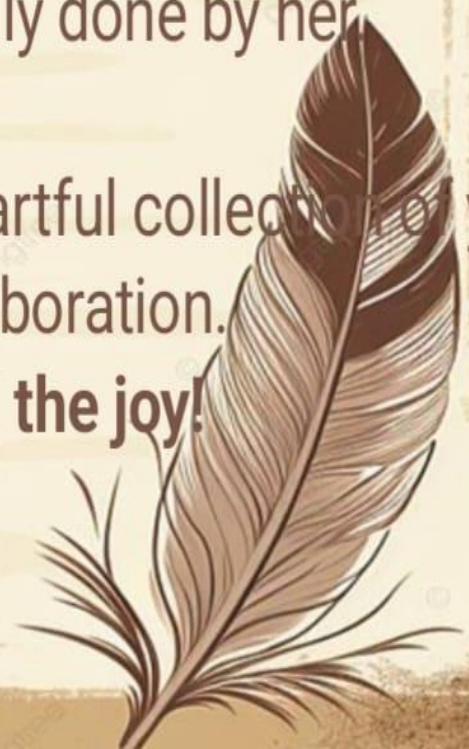
“From Moments to Memories”

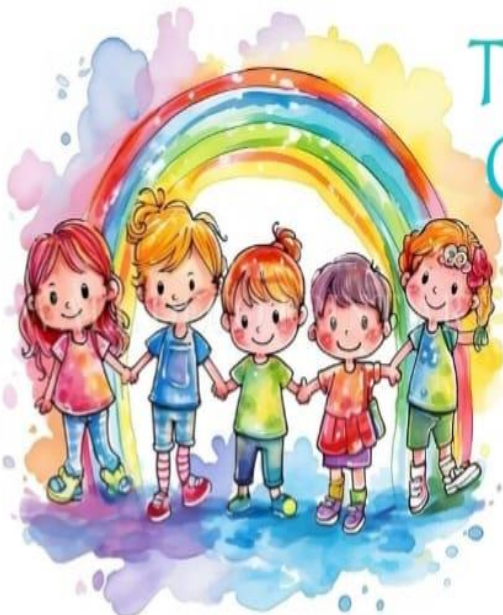


FRIEND WITH MEMORIES

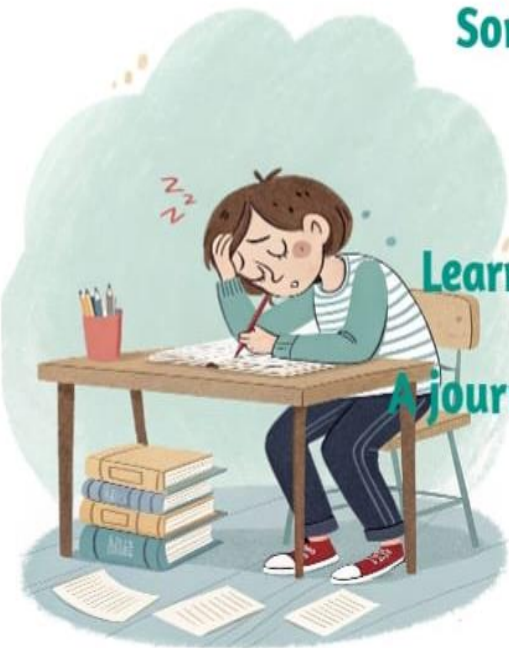
In the morning sun, I wake and sigh,

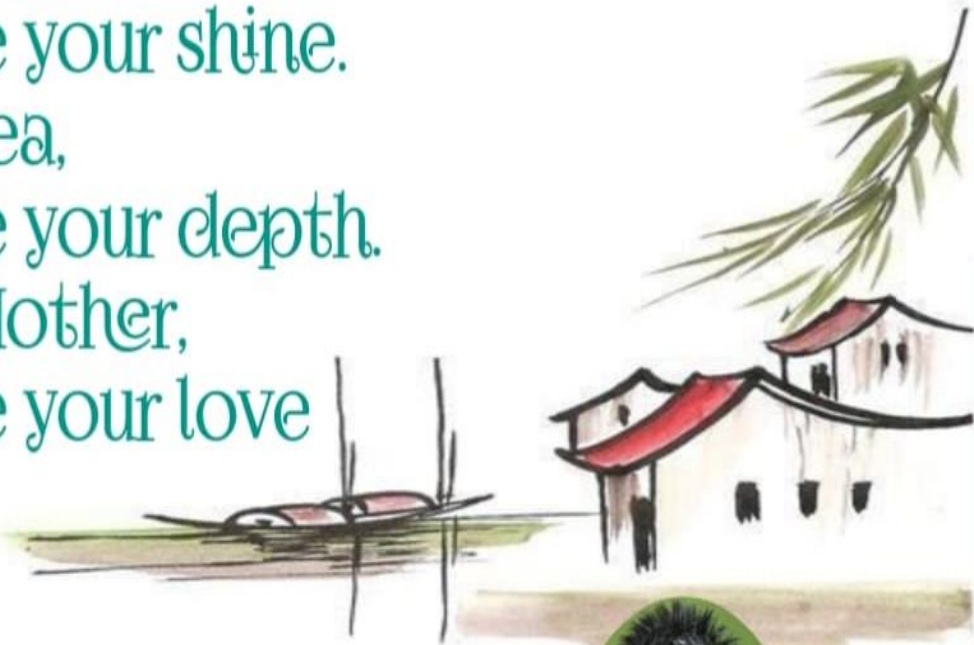

The World Ozone Day

The earth consists of different types of atmosphere. In the between of the Troposphere and Stratosphere, there is a layer called ozone layer which contains ozone (O₃) gas. It is generally located between 15 to 25 kilometers from the earth surface.

It is a fragile shield of gas which protects the earth from the harmful portion of the sun. The ozone layer mainly absorbs the sun harmful U-VB radiation.

The ozone layer is thinning due to human produced chemicals. Human specially produce Chloroflouro carbons (CFC) Ozone depleting substances (ODS). It can lead to increase the rated of skin cancer, cataracts and immune system. It can also negatively impact marine life, agriculture and ecosystem.

So, we should minimize the use of ozone depleting substances like CFCs (from ac and refrigerator), opt for eco friendly products and reliance of vehicles, especially using public transport or by using cycles.

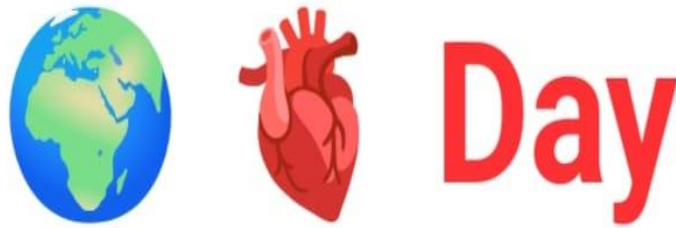

দুর্গা পূজা

হিন্দুদের প্রধান জাতীয় উৎসব হলো দুর্গাপূজা। বাঙ্গালীদের শ্রেষ্ঠ উৎসব বলতে বোঝায় দুর্গোৎসব। দুর্গাপূজা সাধারণত শরৎকাল অর্থাৎ আশ্বিন মাসে পালিত হয়। শরতের কাশফুল শিউলি ফুলের শোভায় মা দুর্গার আগমন যেন আরো অপূর্ব হয়ে ওঠে। দুর্গা ষষ্ঠীর এক সপ্তাহ আগে কৃষ্ণপক্ষের শেষ দিন অর্থাৎ অমাবস্যার দিন মহালয়া পালিত হয়। আশ্বিন মাসের দ্বিতীয় শুক্লাপক্ষে দুর্গা পূজা শুরু হয়। দুর্গাপূজা সাধারণত পাঁচ দিন ধরে পালিত হয়। পঞ্চমী, ষষ্ঠী, সপ্তমী, অষ্টমী, নবমী ও দশমী। মহালয়ার দিন দেবীর চক্ষুদান হয়। মাতা তাঁর সন্তানসহ মর্ত্যে আসেন। মাকে আমরা "নব দুর্গা" নামে জানি। মায়ের নয়টি রূপ হল - শৈলপুত্রী, ব্রহ্মচারিণী, চন্দ্রঘন্টা, কুশ্মাভা, স্কন্দমাতা, কাত্যায়নী, কালরাত্রি, মহাগৌরী, সিদ্ধিদাত্রী। এছাড়াও পার্বতী, উমা, মহামায়া, মহিষাসুরমর্দিনী ইত্যাদি নামেও আমরা তাঁকে চিনি। তবে সবার মধ্যে দুর্গা হল প্রকৃত নাম, যা সারা পৃথিবীর লোক জানে। ষষ্ঠীর দিন দেবীর বোধনের মধ্য দিয়ে পূজার সূচনা হয়। সপ্তমীর দিন বিশেষ পূজা ও আরতি করা হয়। অষ্টমীর দিন কুমারী পূজা হয়, যেখানে কুমারী মেয়েদের দেবী রূপে পূজা করা হয় এবং সন্ধি পূজা এই দিনের মূল আকর্ষণ। নবমীর দিন হোম, যজ্ঞ এবং পূজা ও আরতি করা হয়। সবশেষে দশমীর দিন মায়ের বিসর্জনের মাধ্যমে শুভ বিজয়া, সিঁদুর খেলা ও মিষ্টিমুখ করা হয়। পূজার এই পাঁচ দিন আনন্দ উৎসবের মাধ্যমে খুব দ্রুত কেটে যায়। সবার মন খুব খারাপ হয়ে যায়। আরো একটি বছর সবাইকে অপেক্ষা করতে হয়। দুর্গাপূজা হিন্দুদের পূজা হলেও এখানে বিভিন্ন ধর্মের মানুষের সমাগম হয় এবং সবাই এই পূজার আনন্দ উপভোগ করে।।

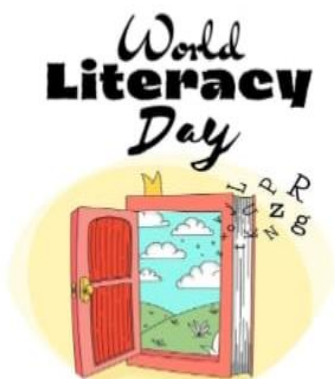


International Literacy Day

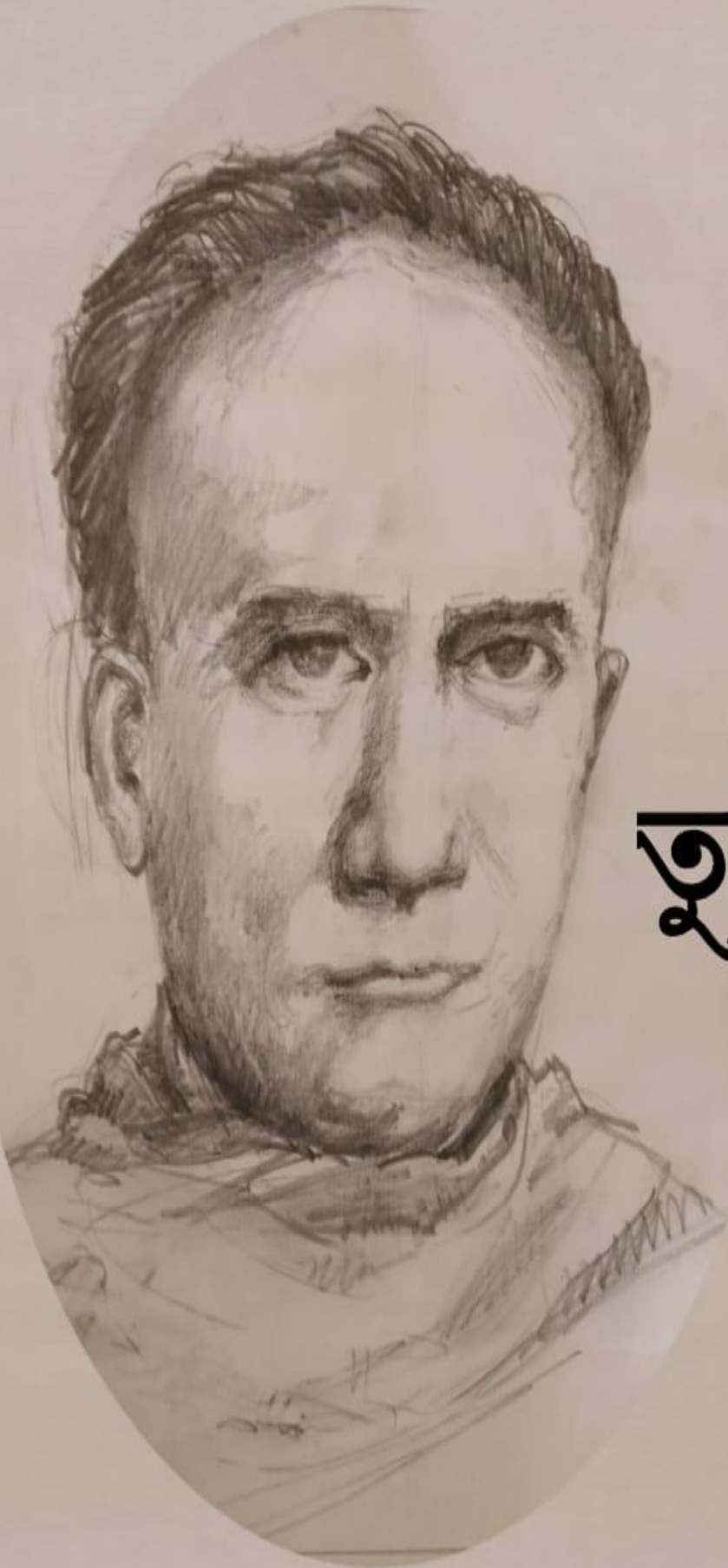

Ocean of Generosity

Once Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar was travelling by train in a compartment with some Englishmen. He sat between two of them. One man asked, "Who is this donkey?" The other asked, "Who is this pig?" A third Englishman asked, "Who are you?" Ishwar Chandra coolly replied, "I am a human being sitting between a donkey and a pig." The two Englishmen felt ashamed of themselves. They felt even more ashamed when they saw a large crowd of people waiting with garlands to receive Ishwar Chandra when he got down from the train. The Englishmen then realised that though Indians might appear simple and unlettered, they were inherently noble and gentle. Legends such as these about Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar have been a part of Bengal's public memory since the nineteenth century. Vidyasagar represented an aspiration of upward mobility even in the face of a colonial government; that even an Indian could command respect even from the British empire. Born as Ishwar Chandra Bandyopadhyay on 26th September, 1820 in West Bengal, he was bestowed the title of Vidyasagar in 1839 for his mastery over Sanskrit and philosophy. At the age of twenty one, Ishwar Chandra joined the Fort William College as the head of the Sanskrit department.

He helped revered Bengali poet Michael Madhusudan Dutta to relocate from France to England and study for the bar. He also felicitated his return to India and inspired him to write poetry in Bengali creating some of the most legendary literary works in the language. Michael Madhusudan is understood to have given him the epithet 'Dayasagar'. Vidyasagar considered his mother a "paragon of virtue" and a living deity, idolizing her and holding her in the highest esteem. He would bow to her portrait even when away from home before starting his daily activities. His book 'Borno Porichoy' meaning 'introduction to the letter' is still used as the introductory text to learn Bengali alphabet. He founded 35 schools for girls throughout Bengal. The Metropolitan School of Calcutta was one of the institutions. The sole purpose of these schools was to make women self-sufficient and empowered. Vidyasagar's work on social reforms include 'Bidhobabivah' on widow's right to remarry (1855), 'Bahubivah' on banning of polygamy (1871) and Balyabivah on the flaws of child marriage. His principles continue to resonate today, with education viewed as a key to social change and his advocacy for women's rights and social justice remaining relevant in the ongoing fight for gender equal.

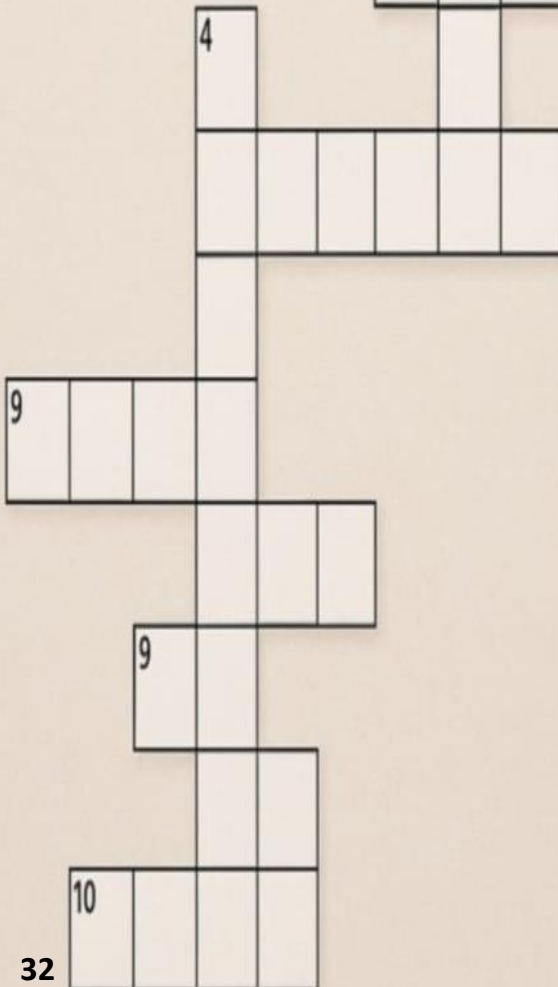

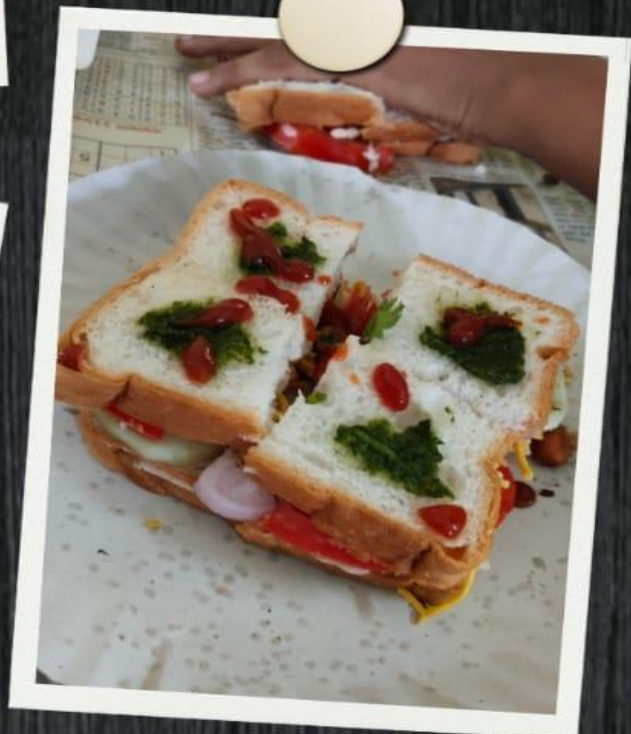
